

Trisha YearwoodAward Winning Artist

With over three decades in the spotlight, multiple GRAMMY®, CMA®, and ACM® Awards, and millions of albums sold, Trisha Yearwood's passion for music remains as strong as ever. The iconic singer, actress, author, chef, and entrepreneur continues to captivate audiences with her powerhouse vocals and heartfelt storytelling.

A revered figure in country music, Trisha has been honored with inductions into the Austin City Limits Hall of Fame, the Grand Ole Opry, Stars on the Hollywood Walk of Fame and Nashville Music City Walk of Fame, as well as prestigious awards including the ACM Honors Icon Award, CMT's June Carter Cash Humanitarian Award and an Honorary Doctorate from Belmont University.

Raised in Monticello, Georgia, Trisha's early influences—including Patsy Cline and Linda Ronstadt —shaped her into one of the genre's most beloved vocalists. She attended Belmont University in Nashville, Tennessee, where she pursued a degree in music business. This move placed her at the heart of the country music industry, where she gained invaluable experience working as an intern at MTM Records. Her talent and work ethic soon earned her opportunities as a session singer working with established artists.

Her 1991 debut album, Trisha Yearwood, skyrocketed to success, making her the first female country artist to have a debut single reach No. 1 on the charts with "She's in Love with the Boy." From there, she delivered a string of platinum and gold albums, cementing her legacy with timeless hits like "Walkaway Joe," "XXX's and OOO's (An American Girl)," and "How Do I Live."

With 15 studio albums and over 15 million records sold, Trisha's ability to blend country music with contemporary sounds has made her a genre-defining artist. Her accolades include multiple CMA Female Vocalist of the Year awards and GRAMMY®-winning collaborations, including "In Another's Eyes" with Garth Brooks.

In 2019, Trisha released Every Girl, her first full-length country album in over a decade, followed by Every Girl: Deluxe, which featured an acoustic version of her career-defining debut hit, "She's in Love with the Boy." Originally topping the charts in 1991, the song made history once again in 2021 when it was named the most-listened-to country song by a female artist in the history of Billboard's Country Airplay Charts.

For the first time in her iconic career, Trisha is set to release an upcoming album, The Mirror, where she co-wrote every song, ushering in a new chapter as both a singer and songwriter. The first preview of this deeply personal project, "Put It In A Song," was hailed by Rolling Stone as "an instant classic."

As she steps into this new era, one thing remains the same: Trisha Yearwood's voice—both as a singer and a songwriter—continues to move hearts and make history. Trisha's impact extends far beyond music. She is a New York Times-bestselling author, with four beloved cookbooks that celebrate her Southern roots. Her Emmy® Award-winning Food Network series, "Trisha's Southern Kitchen," has introduced fans to her warm, down-to-earth approach to cooking. She has also expanded into home and lifestyle design, creating cookware, furniture, and home accessories that reflect her signature style.

In 2023, she co-opened Friends In Low Places, the largest bar and honky-tonk in Nashville's Lower Broadway, featuring menus curated by Trisha herself.

Beyond her artistic and entrepreneurial success, Trisha Yearwood is deeply committed to philanthropy. She has been an active supporter of Habitat for Humanity, participating in numerous home builds alongside former President Jimmy Carter and first lady Rosalynn Carter. She has also been a strong advocate for breast cancer research, working to raise awareness and funding for life-saving treatments. Additionally, Trisha has contributed to disaster relief efforts, helping communities rebuild after natural disasters.

In 2021, Trisha established Dottie's Yard, a charity dedicated to supporting animal shelters across all 50 states. Named after her beloved dog, Dottie, who lived to be 14 years old, Dottie's Yard provides financial assistance to shelters, helping cover medical bills, nutrition, and basic needs for animals in need.

Trisha's dedication to giving back reflects the same warmth and generosity that define her music and career, making a lasting impact on both people and animals in need.
